

- Your pet will be better behaved, friendlier and less likely to fight, bite, or run away.
- Your neutered cat is less likely to spray and mark territory.

Holiday Health Tips

Be Careful With Seasonal Plants and Decorations

- **Christmas Tree:** Securely anchor your Christmas tree so it doesn't tip and fall, causing possible injury to your pet.
- **Avoid Mistletoe & Holly:** Holly, when ingested, can cause pets to suffer nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. Mistletoe can cause gastrointestinal upset and cardiovascular problems.
- **Holiday Glow:** Don't leave lit candles unattended. Pets may burn themselves or cause a fire if they knock candles over.

- **Tinsel-less Town:** Kitties love this sparkly, light-catching "toy" that's easy to bat around and carry in their mouths. But a nibble can lead to a swallow, which can lead to an obstructed digestive tract, severe vomiting, dehydration and possible surgery.
- **Wired Up:** Keep wires, batteries and glass or plastic ornaments out of paws reach.
