SURRENDER TO A SHELTER IS STRESSFUL FOR CATS AND THIER OWNERS

STRAY CATS

MOST CATS ARE FOUND WITHIN A FEW MILES OF THEIR HOMES. RCAC ENCOURAGES PEOPLE WHO HAVE FOUND LOST CATS TO FIRST ATTEMPT TO REUNITE THE CAT WITH THEIR FAMILY BY:

- HAVING THE CAT SCANNED FOR A MICROCHIP
- USING NEIGHBORHOOD AND SOCIAL MEDIA APPS TO PUBLICIZE FOUND CATS
- POSTING FLYERS IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD
- CONTACT RCAC FOR ADVICE ON OTHER EFFECTIVE REUNIFICATION STRATEGIES





TRAP NEUTER RELEASE (TNR)

HEALTHY FREE-ROAMING CATS SHOULD NOT BE RELIQUISHED TO RCAC IF THEY APPEAR TO BE THRIVING IN THEIR CURRENT ENVIRONMENT

- RCAC OFFERS A FREE TNR PROGRAM TO CATS RESIDING IN RANCHO CUCAMONGA
- THE PURPOSE OF THE TNR PROGRAM IS TO SPAY AND NEUTER FERAL CATS AND REDUCE THE NUMBER OF UNWANTED LITTERS.

PUBLIC SAFETY AND ANIMAL WELFARE

RCAC RECOGNIZES THAT SOME CATS MUST BE IMMEDIATELY BROUGHT TO THE ANIMAL CENTER FOR THEIR OWN SAFETY OR THE SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC. CATS THAT ARE SICK OR INJURED WILL BE ACCEPTED SO MEDICAL ASSISTANCE CAN BE PROVIDED. ADDITIONAL SITUATIONS MAY INCLUDE AN OWNER'S SUDDEN AND COMPLETE INABILITY TO PROVIDE CARE, ANIMAL CRUELTY AND NEGLECT CASES, AND OTHER SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES.
