



## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### STATION OVERVIEW



#### What is Cucamonga Station?

Serving as a key transportation hub for multiple modes of transportation service, Cucamonga Station will be a full-service transit facility that includes the existing Metrolink platforms (located at 11208 Azusa Court, just west of Milliken Avenue) and new construction for Omnitrans expanded bus services. High-speed rail service Brightline West is planned to construct a passenger rail station on-premises with service between Rancho Cucamonga and Las Vegas with station stops in the High Desert.

### OUR REGIONAL PARTNERS



#### Who are the core partners who have joined together in the marketing and outreach effort for this major transit project?

The City of Rancho Cucamonga, Greater Ontario California (GOCAL), Omnitrans, Ontario International Airport (ONT), and San Bernardino County have established a joint effort for the project development and outreach programs. Additional project partners will be added as the project moves forward through the development process.

- **City of Rancho Cucamonga** – Cucamonga Station at the newly branded HART District, is a mixed-use, transit-oriented development encompassing the general areas of Haven Avenue, Arrow Route, Rochester Avenue and the Transit District in Rancho Cucamonga.
- **Omnitrans** – As part of the new Cucamonga Station, Omnitrans will build new multi-bay bus terminals and include a key stop for the West Valley Connector Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) service, which is expected to begin operation in 2025. - **Greater Ontario California (GOCAL)** – Improving public transit connectivity and promoting hospitality options throughout the region is key to attracting more national and international visitors. - **Ontario International Airport (ONT)** – Identified as the fastest-growing airport in the United States, ONT provides an incredible opportunity for continued growth during the coming decades. To better serve the region and improve connectivity, ONT, in partnership with San Bernardino County Transportation Authority (SBCTA), are exploring an underground tunnel connection between Cucamonga Station and the airport terminals. ### What are the benefits of Cucamonga Station to the community and region?

Cucamonga Station is located in the newly branded "HART District" that encompasses the general areas of Haven Avenue, Arrow Route, Rochester Avenue and the identified Transit District. The Station's strategic location makes the vision for the HART District as a 21st Century Employment District a reality, creating a catalyst for employment growth; an economic driver for technology, businesses, entertainment, and development; and a touchstone for a thriving community culture.

The HART District is a transit-oriented, mixed-use district with amenities accessible within walking distance and an active community that will be a business and destination "hot spot," elevating the area into a walkable, culture-rich experience. The development of Cucamonga Station and the HART District provides opportunities for job creation, corporate settings, a destination for hotel stays and a thriving hospitality industry.

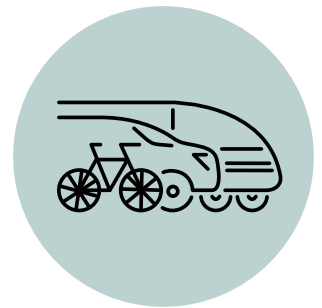


## TRANSPORTATION CONNECTIVITY AND AMENITIES



### What type of transportation providers / amenities will be located at Cucamonga Station?

- The Metrolink San Bernardino line will continue to provide passenger train service from San Bernardino to Los Angeles. In October 2022, Metrolink's Arrow Line began passenger rail service between Redlands and San Bernardino.
- Omnitrans will provide Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) and local bus service.
- Brightline West\*, a private high-speed rail company, will construct, own and operate a passenger rail line between Las Vegas and Southern California, with stations in Las Vegas, Town of Apple Valley, Hesperia, and Rancho Cucamonga. The company has purchased land at Cucamonga Station to build the station and is working on the design phase. Environmental clearance for the overall project was achieved in July 2023. Cucamonga Station will seamlessly connect passengers to destinations throughout Southern California and beyond via Metrolink and ONT.
- The entrance to the anticipated tunnel connection to ONT terminals.
- Omnitrans currently provides FREE shuttle services from Cucamonga Station to ONT terminals. This service launched in 2022.
- Automobile/rideshare.
- 6th Street Bicycle Track with plans for extended bicycle connections.



*\* Plans for restaurants, retail, residential, hotel and/or office space are also in the works!*

## CURRENT PASSENGER RAIL DEMAND



### How many riders currently use the San Bernardino Line Metrolink Rancho Cucamonga Station stop?

Rancho Cucamonga is the second-busiest station only behind Los Angeles' Union Station on the Metrolink San Bernardino Line. Almost 1,500 average daily on-boardings/off-boardings occurred during weekdays at the Rancho Cucamonga Station stop (FY 2019). Increased ridership along the San Bernardino Line is expected to increase as the Arrow Line passenger rail service between San Bernardino and Redlands began operation in October 2022.

## PROJECT TIMELINE



### What is the anticipated construction timeline for this project?

While an exact timeline has not been established, the following provides a general schedule:

**Environmental Phase:** Completed in July 2023

**Design Phase:** In Process

**Construction Phase:** TBD; projected construction timeline is 3 1/2 years from the start.\*
