Senate Bill 1383

Senate Bill 1383 is a California Senate Bill that focuses on reducing and properly recycling food waste to reduce harmful greenhouse gas emissions such as methane in our state. Reducing greenhouse gas emissions like methane can help improve air quality and lessen the impacts on health conditions such as asthma.

All residents of Rancho Cucamonga are required to divert food waste from the landfill by collecting food scraps (i.e. fruits, vegetables, food-soiled paper, leftovers, etc.) in a bag and placing the secured food scraps bag into your green waste bin.

What is Composting?

Composting is the process of recycling organic matter, such as leaves and food scraps, into a valuable fertilizer that can enrich soil and plants.

AT-HOME COMPOST DO'S & DONT'S

Some items that can be composted through the City's food waste collection program cannot be composted at home. Here are some important Do's & Dont's for At-Home Composting.

*Pet waste should not go into at-home compost or your green waste bin. Pet waste should be bagged and thrown into the black trash bin.

Residential Christmas Tree Collection

Burrtec will collect and recycle your Christmas tree. Please place your tree at the curb from December 26, 2023, through January 15, 2024, on your regular collection day. Trees over 6 feet need to be cut in half. Please remove all ornaments, lights, and metal stands from the tree.





Extra Holiday Trash and Recycling

All gift boxes, wrapping paper, greeting cards, and cardboard boxes may be placed in your recycle barrel. Burrtec will collect your excess trash from December 26, 2023 through January 15, 2024. Place in a plastic bag alongside your containers on your collection day.
