


LMD 4-R was formed in 1984 and consists of single-family homes, condominiums, multi-family units, commercial, and vacant properties. Each year, property owners within LMD 4-R pay an annual amount through their annual property tax bill to support the maintenance of the District and its capital cost.


To improve the service level of LMD 4-R, property owners passed Proposition 218 ballots on December 2, 2009.



With the funds collected, LMD 4-R maintains six parks and landscaping in public areas such as turf, ground cover, shrubs, trees, trails, paseos, sprinklers, and irrigation systems.

## **DROUGHT & WATER** CONSERVATION

To comply with statewide water conservation mandates, the City of Rancho Cucamonga has stopped irrigation of "non-functional" turf within some City parkways. This does not include trees and grass used for recreation, such as sports fields, school yards, and parks.
