



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Our capstone research question is: "What communitybased strategies can effectively reduce homelessness in Rancho Cucamonga by addressing root causes and implementing solutions?"







RENT BURDEN & FINANCIAL STABILITY




CITY HEALTH DASHBOARD 2022

54% of renters and 31% of homeowners in Rancho Cucamonga are considered cost-burdened.




QUALITY OF LIFE SURVEY (2023)

84% of people who disagree with housing options experience difficulty paying bills most of the time.



SURVEY & DATA COLLECTION

- We created a survey to gather demographic information and assess public awareness and perception regarding homelessness in the city. The questions focused on age, gender, education level, frequency of encountering homeless individuals, and awareness of available homelessness resources.
- We surveyed the general population of Rancho Cucamonga, with 42 participants:
 - 90% under 18
 - 93% are in high school or have a GED, suggesting the need for youth-targeted awareness campaigns.
 - 92% of respondents are unaware of any homelessness resources, highlighting a major gap in communication.









SURVEY & DATA COLLECTION


 The findings reveal a significant lack of public awareness about existing homelessness resources — only 3 respondents reported knowing about them, and even then, they could not name specific services. This highlights a critical need for better public outreach and education. These results also support the need for centralized services, like a Navigation Center, to make help more visible, accessible, and approachable.


Are you aware of any resources for homeless people?

WHAT WE'VE DONE SO FAR

- Provided testimony on the City's Camping Ordinance, highlighting its goal to balance public safety with compassion by prioritizing connections to wraparound services and long-term housing over enforcement.
- Met with the San Bernardino
 County Department of Behavioral
 Health and other key service
 providers to gain deeper
 understanding of the challenges.






PROPOSED POLICIES & STRATEGIES

- Interim Housing/Motel Vouchers: Provide safe, temporary shelter while individuals access support services.
- Family Reunification Vouchers: Help reconnect individuals with family, a key step toward recovery and stability.
- Navigation Center: Centralized access to housing, health, and job services to support long-term stability. Ideally near City Hall.

- Rental Assistance & Job Training:
 Prevent homelessness by reducing housing costs and building pathways to employment.
- Strong Awareness Campaign: Inform the public about available support systems.
